Kester has worked for FSA for 33 years, and most recently served as the FSA County Executive Director for Polk, Hillsborough and Pinellas Counties in Florida. Prior to her role in Florida, she served as the Farm Programs Disaster Specialist and Farm Programs Chief for FSA in Kentucky.

As SED, Kester is responsible for overseeing the delivery of FSA programs to agricultural producers in Florida. These commodity, conservation, credit, and disaster assistance programs ensure a safe, affordable, abundant and nutritious food, fiber, and fuel supply for all Americans.
