### USDA Designates Four Montana Counties as Natural Disaster Areas Ten Contiguous Counties Also Eligible for Assistance Emergency Designation | Montana | July 03, 2025

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Montana

Triggering Disaster: Drought

Application Deadline: February 17, 2026

Primary Counties Eligible: Flathead, Glacier, Pondera and Teton

#### Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

• **Montana**: Cascade, Chouteau, Lake, Lewis and Clark, Liberty, Lincoln, Missoula, Powell, Sanders and Toole
