



USDA Announces Availability of Low-Interest Physical Loss Loans for Producers Affected by Natural Disasters, Three Contiguous Montana Counties Also Eligible

Emergency Designation | Montana | July 10, 2025

Physical loss loans through the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) can help producers repair or replace damaged or destroyed physical property essential to the success of the agricultural operation, including livestock losses. Examples of property commonly affected include essential farm buildings, fixtures to real estate, equipment, livestock, perennial crops, fruit and nut bearing trees, and harvested or stored crops and hay.

Impacted Area: North Dakota

Triggering Disaster: Wildfire and High Winds

Application Deadline: 3/9/2026

Primary Counties Eligible:

- **North Dakota:** McKenzie

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

- **Montana:** Richland, Roosevelt and Wibaux
- **North Dakota:** Billings, Dunn, Golden Valley, Mountrail and Williams
