



USDA Designates 12 Nebraska Counties as Natural Disaster Areas Due to Drought

Emergency Designation | Nebraska | July 29, 2025

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Nebraska

Triggering Disaster: Drought (Fast Track)

Application Deadline: 03/16/2026

Primary Counties Eligible:

- **State:** Nebraska: Counties include Butler, Fillmore, Frontier, Furnas, Gosper, Hayes, Hitchcock, Phelps, Polk, Red Willow, Seward and York

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

- **State:** Nebraska: Counties include Buffalo, Chase, Clay, Colfax, Dawson, Dodge, Dundy, Franklin, Hamilton, Harlan, Jefferson, Kearney, Lancaster, Lincoln, Merrick, Nuckolls, Perkins, Platte, Saline, Saunders, and Thayer
- **State:** Kansas: Counties include Decatur, Norton and Rawlins
