



USDA Designates 8 Indiana Counties as Natural Disaster Area due to Excessive Rain

Emergency Designation | Indiana | September 03, 2025

Indiana

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. The FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Indiana

Triggering Disaster: Excessive rain that occurred on March 30, 2025, and continuing.

Application Deadline: April 4, 2026

Primary Counties Eligible:

- Indiana - Ripley County

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

- Indiana: Dearborn, Decatur, Franklin, Jefferson, Jennings, Ohio, and Switzerland Counties.
