



USDA Designate 3 Kentucky Counties as Natural Disaster Areas due to Flooding, Excessive Rain, Flash Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides **Emergency Designation | Kentucky | January 28, 2026**

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Kentucky

Triggering Disaster S6124: Flooding, excessive rain, flash flooding, landslides, and mudslides that occurred April 2, 2025 through April 15, 2025

Application Deadline: August 24, 2026

Primary Counties Eligible:

- **Kentucky:** Allen, Edmonson, Warren

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

- **Kentucky:** Barren, Butler, Grayson, Hart, Logan, Monroe, Simpson
- **Tennessee:** Macon, Sumner
