



USDA Designates 8 Ohio Counties as Natural Disaster Area due to Drought Emergency Designation | Ohio | February 03, 2026

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. The FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Ohio

Triggering Disaster: Drought.

Application Deadline: May 22, 2026

Primary Counties Eligible:

- Ohio: Carroll, Columbiana, and Jefferson Counties.

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

- Ohio: Belmont, Harrison, Mahoning, Stark, and Tuscarawas Counties.
- Pennsylvania: Beaver and Lawrence Counties.
- West Virginia: Brooke, Hancock and Ohio Counties.
