

USDA Designates Two California Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

Emergency Designation | July 06, 2021

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <u>emergency loans</u>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

According to the U.S. Drought Monitor (see http://droughtmonitor.unl.edu/), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: California

Triggering Disaster: Drought

Application Deadline: Feb. 22, 2022

Primary Counties Eligible: Orange and San Diego

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Imperial, Los Angeles, Riverside and San Bernardino
