



## USDA Designates Five New Jersey Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

**Emergency Designation | October 15, 2021**

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

**Impacted Area:** New Jersey

**Triggering Disaster #1:** Excessive rain that occurred during Aug. 21 through Sept. 2, 2021.

**Application Deadline:** June 7, 2022

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Morris, Sussex and Warren

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

New Jersey: Essex, Hunterdon, Passaic, Somerset and Union

New York: Orange

**Pennsylvania:** Bucks, Monroe, Northampton and Pike

**Triggering Disaster #2:** Hurricane Ida that occurred during Sept. 1 through Sept. 2, 2021

**Application Deadline:** June 7, 2022

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Hunterdon and Somerset

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**
