



USDA Designates Seven New Hampshire Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

News Release | New Hampshire | February 22, 2022

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: New Hampshire

Triggering Disaster: Excessive moisture that occurred from June 1, 2021, through Nov. 30, 2021.

Application Deadline: Oct. 11, 2022

Primary Counties Eligible:

Belknap	Hillsborough	Rockingham	Sullivan
Cheshire	Merrimack	Strafford	

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

New Hampshire: Carroll and Grafton

Maine: York

Massachusetts: Essex, Franklin, Middlesex and Worcester

Vermont: Windham and Windsor
