



USDA Designates Six South Carolina Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

News Release | South Carolina | July 14, 2022

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: South Carolina

Triggering Disaster: Freezing temperatures and high winds that occurred from March 12 through March 14, 2022.

Application Deadline: Feb. 28, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: Cherokee, Edgefield, Greenville, Saluda, Spartanburg and Union

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: **South Carolina:** Abbeville, Aiken, Anderson, Chester, Fairfield, Greenwood, Laurens, Lexington, McCormick, Newberry, Pickens and York

Georgia: Columbia and Richmond

North Carolina: Cleveland, Henderson, Polk, Rutherford and Transylvania
