

## USDA Designates Three Massachusetts Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

Emergency Designation | November 04, 2022

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through <a href="mailto:emergency loans">emergency loans</a>. Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

According to the <u>U.S. Drought Monitor</u>, these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Massachusetts

Triggering Disaster: Excessive heat and drought that occurred from May 9, 2022, and continuing

**Application Deadline**: May 30, 2023

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Berkshire, Hampden and Hampshire

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Massachusetts: Franklin and Worcester

Connecticut: Hartford, Litchfield and Tolland

New York: Columbia, Dutchess and Rensselaer

Vermont: Bennington
