



## Three Iowa Counties Designated As USDA Primary Natural Disaster Areas

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

**Impacted Area:** Iowa

**Triggering Disaster:** Drought

**Application Deadline:** May 26, 2023

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Harrison, Humboldt and Kossuth

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:** Iowa: Crawford, Monona, Pottawattamie, Winnebago, Emmet, Palo Alto, Shelby, Wright, Hancock, Pocahontas and Webster

**Minnesota:** Faribault and Martin

**Nebraska:** Burt and Washington
