



USDA Designates Stanislaus County, California, as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

Emergency Designation | February 09, 2023

This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation or the refinance of certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: California

Triggering Disaster: Excessively high temperatures that occurred from September 1, 2022, through September 9, 2022

Application Deadline: Sept. 13, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: Stanislaus
