



Federal Emergency Management Agency Designates 12 Additional Kentucky Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas - (M) News Release | Indiana | May 31, 2023

Indiana Counties of Clark, Floyd, Harrison, Posey, Vanderburgh and Warrick

Indianapolis, May 31, 2023 - This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Kentucky

Triggering Disaster: Severe storms, straight-line winds, tornadoes, flooding, landslides and mudslides that occurred March 3, 2023 through March 4, 2023

Application Deadline: January 18, 2024

Primary Counties Eligible: 12 Additional Kentucky Counties

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

- **Indiana:** Clark, Floyd, Harrison, Posey, Vanderburgh and Warrick
- **Kentucky:** 26 Additional Counties
- **Tennessee:** Campbell, Clay, Pickett and Scott
