



USDA Designates Teton County in Wyoming as Primary Natural Disaster Area Several Contiguous Counties, Including Gallatin County Montana, Also Eligible for Assistance

BOZEMAN, Montana, June 30, 2023-This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

Impacted Area: Wyoming, Montana, Idaho

Triggering Disaster: Drought

Application Deadline: 02/26/2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Teton

Wyoming: Fremont, Lincoln, Park, Sublette
