



Oklahoma Counties Designated as Natural Disaster Areas per the Federal Emergency Management Agency

News Release | Oklahoma | July 10, 2023

This Presidential disaster declaration allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

Impacted Area: Texas and Oklahoma

Triggering Disaster: Severe Winter Storm

Application Deadline: December 8, 2023

Triggering Disaster 2: Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, and Tornadoes

Application Deadline: December 26, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: McClain and Pottawatomie

Oklahoma: Canadian, Cleveland, Garvin, Grady, Lincoln, Okfuskee, Oklahoma, Pontotoc, Seminole

Triggering Disaster 3: Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, and Tornadoes

Application Deadline: January 8, 2024

Primary Counties Eligible: Cleveland

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Oklahoma: Canadian, McClain, Oklahoma, Pottawatomie

Triggering Disaster 2: Severe Storms, Straight-line Winds, and Tornadoes occurring April 19-20, 2023

Application Deadline: December 26, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: McClain and Pottawatomie

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:

Oklahoma: Canadian, Cleveland, Garvin, Grady, Lincoln, Okfuskee, Oklahoma, Pontotoc, Seminole
