

## USDA Designates 8 South Carolina Counties as Primary Natural Disaster Areas

**News Release | South Carolina | December 07, 2023**

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This Secretarial natural disaster designation allows the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) to extend much-needed emergency credit to producers recovering from natural disasters through [emergency loans](#). Emergency loans can be used to meet various recovery needs including the replacement of essential items such as equipment or livestock, reorganization of a farming operation, or to refinance certain debts. FSA will review the loans based on the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

According to the [U.S. Drought Monitor](#), these counties suffered from a drought intensity value during the growing season of 1) D2 Drought-Severe for 8 or more consecutive weeks or 2) D3 Drought-Extreme or D4 Drought-Exceptional.

**Impacted Area:** South Carolina

**Triggering Disaster:** Drought

**Application Deadline:** 07/15/2024

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Cherokee, Greenville, Spartanburg and Union.

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

**South Carolina:** Abbeville, Chester, Laurens, Pickens, Anderson, Fairfield, Newberry and York.

**Triggering Disaster 2:** Drought

**Application Deadline:** 07/22/2024

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Chester, Oconee, Pickens and York.

### **Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:**

South Carolina: Anderson, Cherokee, Fairfield, Greenville, Lancaster and Union.
