



## **Nebraska USDA Disaster Designation Impacts Four Iowa Counties**

**News Release | Iowa | March 31, 2023**

Iowa  
A Secretarial Disaster Designation has been issued for 55 counties in Nebraska as primary disaster areas for drought. Additionally, four (4) Iowa counties are contiguous to the disaster area. This determination will allow the Farm Service Agency's Emergency Loans to be made available to eligible family farmers with qualifying production and physical losses in the primary and the contiguous counties to the declared disaster area.

**Secretarial Declaration Number:** S5392

**Emergency Loan Application Deadline:** December 1, 2023

**Primary Counties Eligible:** Primary counties located in Nebraska

**Contiguous Counties Also Eligible:** Harrison, Monona, Pottawattamie, Woodbury (Iowa)

**Disaster Description:** Drought. April 1, 2023, beginning date of incident period.
