



USDA Designates Nine Iowa Counties as Disaster Areas Due to Drought

News Release | Iowa | March 31, 2023

A Secretarial Disaster Designation has been issued for three (3) counties in Iowa as primary disaster areas for drought. Additionally, six (6) Iowa counties are contiguous to the disaster area. This determination will allow the Farm Service Agency's Emergency Loans to be made available to eligible family farmers with qualifying production and physical losses in the primary and the contiguous counties to the declared disaster area.

Secretarial Declaration Number: S5391

Emergency Loan Application Deadline: December 1, 2023

Primary Counties Eligible: Harrison, Monona, Woodbury (Iowa)

Contiguous Counties Also Eligible: Cherokee, Crawford, Ida, Plymouth, Pottawattamie, Shelby (Iowa)

Disaster Description: Drought. April 1, 2023, beginning date of incident period.
