Laurie Boner was appointed by the Trump Administration to serve as the state executive director of the USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) in Wyoming in August 2025.

Boner had a successful 15-year career with the Wyoming Department of Agriculture (WDA) where she worked her way up to a management position overseeing the state's food safety and environmental health program. At WDA, she was a Homeland Security consultant responsible for crafting the agency's comprehensive homeland security plan. Throughout her career, she provided leadership and oversight, improved efficiency and cost-effectiveness, and played a key role in developing both state and national policies, all while advocating for agricultural producers and consumers.

For the past 10 years, Boner has devoted much of her time to serving on numerous agriculture-related boards and committees including the Converse County Stock Growers, Converse County Tourism, Wyoming Sheep Foundation, Wyoming State Fair, Wyoming Livestock Board, and Wyoming Stock Growers Land Trust board. In 2023, she started a volunteer program to help the Wyoming State Fair staff with cleanup and maintenance efforts on the state fairgrounds.

In 2021, Boner was honored as the Heart of Agriculture Award recipient and in 2024 she was inducted into the Wyoming Agriculture Hall of Fame.

Boner earned a bachelor's degree in food science from the University of Wyoming. She is also a graduate of the Wyoming Ag Leadership Education and Development Program.

She is a proud Wyoming native with strong agriculture roots. Her knowledge and passion for agriculture came from her grandparents who raised sheep and cattle and her mom who raised and trained Quarter Horses. Boner resides near Glenrock, Wyoming, with ranching operations in both Converse and Natrona counties.
