USDA PATHWAYS PROGRAMS:

 Internships at any of our offices nationwide.

Internships:

Year-round, paid internship for students attending accredited high schools, including homeschooling, or pursuing a certificate, undergraduate or graduate degree at an accredited college, university, or community college.

Recent Graduate Program:

♠ A one-year career development program for recent graduates from an accredited professional, technical, vocational or trade school; community and junior colleges; 4-year colleges/universities; and advanced degree programs. Apply within 2 years of receiving degree; veterans have 6 years to apply after receiving degree.

Presidential Management Fellows:

 A two-year, competitive training and development program managed by the U.S. Office of Personnel Management.



THIRD-PARTY INTERNSHIPS

Students hired at USDA through third-party internship providers typically receive stipends from the providers.

SCHOLARSHIPS

USDA/1890 National Scholars Program:

 USDA, with 19 historically black 1890 land-grant universities, provide full tuition, room and board.

USDA/1994 Tribal Scholar Program:

 USDA, with institutions serving Native Americans, provide tuition, fees, books, use of a personal computer, employment and employee benefits.

OTHER STUDENT PROGRAMS

Federal Student Volunteer Program:

 Unpaid internships - Letter of Understanding between USDA and college or university.

Workforce Recruitment Program for College Students with Disabilities (WRP):

Connects students with disabilities to summer or permanent employment with the federal government. Coordinated by the Department of Labor and Department of Defense, with a consortium of 16 federal agencies.
