














Brainstorm

Form



Description: Premise registration allows for much faster traces when there is an outbreak of an animal disease. Registering your premises is mandatory in WI, but there is no cost associated.

Operate

With your business plan officially in motion you can focus energy on optimization. You will need to be monitoring your balance sheet, evaluating earnings, and utilizing risk management strategy.

Network

The value of peer support and industry professionals cannot be overstated. Many of the most successful farm businesses prioritize producer groups and membership in industry organizations.

Below are some general examples with active memberships. However, there are many others tailored to specific farming enterprises and agriculture products. It is key to seek groups you share interests with.

Wisconsin Farm Bureau Federation (WFBF)

Description: As the largest general farm organization in the state, WFBF serves as a voice for farmers via legislative representation, education, public relations and leadership development.

Wisconsin Farmers Union

Description: A grassroots membership organization committed to enhancing the quality of life for family farmers, rural communities, and all people through education, cooperative endeavors, and civic engagement.

• National Young Farmers Coalition

Description: An intersectional coalition working for justice and collective liberation of our food and farm systems. Work for a future in which people, land, and relationships are respected.

Marbleseed — Farmer-Led and Rooted in Organic

Description: Have worked in community with the Midwest's regenerative and organic farmers for over 30 years by focusing on continuing to grow region's organic farming movement.

Ag Solidarity Network

Description: Connects a diverse network of farmers, farmerworkers, homesteaders, and food system professionals who are collectively growing the organic movement.

Description: Offers resources, inspiration and networking and connection opportunities that supports women wanting to start farms or other rural-based enterprises.


• Wisconsin Women in Conservation
